Tanneron is the capital of the Mimosa. The Mimosa belongs to the Acacia family and was imported from Australia and New Zealand in the 19th Century. Plantations were made and ever since Tanneron's main industry is the commercialisation of the Mimosa. You may also find strawberries, peaches and some excellent honey.

From the church « Notre Dame de Peygros » which can be found at 411m you can discover a panoramic view of the Siagne valley, the Southern alps, the Esterel mountains and Fayence. Tanneron is magnificent throughout the year but in winter when the mimosa is in blossom the scenery is splendid. The whole ground is covered in beautifully perfumed yellow flowers, blue sky and in the background snow covered mountains. Its windy road enables one to discover this unforgettable landscape.

THE VILLAGE

TANNERON

Altitude: 360m Nombre d'habitants: 1497 Surface: 5278 hectares 22 hamlets

This little village sits on the top of a hill in the middle of a huge forest of mimosa. Tanneron is at the eastern edge of the Var. As lovely as this region is, Tanneron isn't a typical tourist site, and much of the population (over 1400) reside in the surrounding area, (22 hamlets

scattered in the hills) rather than in the centre of the village.

From different parts of the village sitting up on the hill, there is a view in nearly every direction right up to the beginning of the Alps. The small central village has a bread shop, grocery store and a couple of cafés.

There's even a post office, hairdressers and petrol station. Nearby sites include a waterfall (Cascade de la Siagne), 12th century chapel, 11th century tower and mill, down the hill at St Cassien des Bois to the northeast.

This beautiful, wild lake is about 7km long northsouth, with an east-west section another 3km long. With its southern tip adjacent to the auto route, only 12km west of Cannes, the St Cassien Lake is easy to get to, but remains natural in a natural environment.

The lake is bordered almost completely by forested hills, and the shoreline is undeveloped, leaving its beauty for all to enjoy. There are some places along the road with ample parking and easy access to the shore, with beached for swimming, picnic tables, and boat, sailboard and canoe rental.

The majority of the shoreline however is isolated and accessible only (if at all) by small trails through the scrub oak and juniper to tiny coves and clear spots suitable for picnicking and swimming.
